Afterward, many continued the celebrations at an after party at the mathematics building until late in the evening.

## 150. birthday of Felix Hausdorff – a Memorial in the city center of Bonn

Besides celebrating the 200 year anniversary of the University of Bonn, we also celebrated the 150th birthday of Felix Hausdorff on November 8th. On this special occasion, the Hausdorff Center informed visitors about the life and work of Felix Hausdorff. At a small booth in the pedestrian area of Bonn (Bonngasse; at the corner to Friedrichstraße), visitors were invited to learn from posters and books about his life and works. The ceremony was opened by the mayor of Bonn Reinhard Limbach. Throughout the day, walks through Bonn and a bike tour to important landmarks connected to Felix Hausdorff such as his family grave at the cemetery in Poppelsdorf took place.



#### **Lectures for the Dies Academicus**






Entry in the Golden Book of Bonn
